

Our newest exhibit spotlights team photos and memorabilia from Jamesville High School. Curator Greg Titus gathered photos of girls' and boys' basketball, baseball, football, and cheerleading teams, stretching from the 1920's through the 1940's. On loan are some varsity letters, pins and cheerleader megaphones.

Jamesville High School played teams from Fayetteville, Manlius, North Syracuse, Tully, Minoa, Lafayette, among others.



Though the high school was built in 1894, the combined auditorium-gymnasium was not added until 1922. The building closed in 1954. Last Friday night, Fayetteville held a one sided court battle with Jame ville, the lowest team in the eastern section of the county league. The girls put up a stiff battle and scored

Jamesville had not been playing ensational basketball all through the season, and were at the bottom of the percentage list. It appeared as though Fayetteville had the game in the bag, and the second team of the local high school started the game instead of the whirlwind first team. Jamesville immediately took advantage of the situation, and rapidly drew away from

The first team was rushed in dur-ing the second half, but Jamesville had gained too much. Fayetteville's varsity, with such a staggering handicap to overcome, lost heart, and although they tried hard enough, their opponents were too much for them.
